

## ADVENT 2021 1st Week of Advent



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace and Joy in Our Lord Jesus!

*The word Advent comes from the Latin words, *advenire* (to come to) & *adventus* (an arrival), and refers to Christ's coming into this world. The Advent season is a time of joyful expectation and preparation for Christmas, the day upon which Christ's birth is celebrated and His first coming into this world. The focus of Advent is upon the centuries of waiting and preparation by God's chosen people, which preceded the coming of the Messiah. As such, it is a time marked by expectation, hope, preparedness and penance. The later being mindful of John the Baptist's cry to prepare for the coming of the Lord with repentance (Treasury of Latin Prayers by Michael Martin).*

*You may have seen the gift-bearing Santa Claus kneeling in prayerful adoration before the Baby Jesus. This representation of Santa Claus, the beloved "Saint Nick" of our childhood, as actually worshiping Christ is also a surprisingly novel and rather touching attempt to "re-Christianize" what has become an essentially secular "saint." There is no lack of truly Christian symbols, however. Many traditions connected with observances of Christmas have their origins in Christian, not pagan, culture, despite what we often read.*

*Our heritage of holiday traditions learned from our families, which we faithfully continue to practice in our homes for our own children, helps to link both the past and the future. We can make this vital connection even stronger when such practices are informed by enthusiastic faith which most of us also received, by the Grace of God, through our families. While there are a variety of Advent and Christmas customs from many cultural traditions, throughout Advent, I will share a few of the popular expressions of faith for you to share with your family.*

### THE ADVENT WREATH

The custom of using Advent wreaths in homes has increased during the past couple of decades, although they have been used in churches in Europe for many generations. The wreath's symbolism of the Advent of Light into the world by Our Lord's birth is clear. The gradual lighting of the wreath, one candle each week of Advent, combined with the liturgical colors of the candles (purple is the penitential color used during Advent and Lent; rose is used only on Gaudete Sunday in Advent and Laetare Sunday in Lent) help to symbolize not only our expectation and joyful hope in Our Lord's first Advent, but also in his Second Coming. During this season we prepare our hearts and our homes to celebrate His birth into our world, of course, but especially to receive Him in preparation for our redemption.

### BLESSING AN ADVENT WREATH

All make the sign of cross as the minister says: **Our help is in the name of the Lord.**

All reply: **Who made heaven and earth.**

One of those present or the minister reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

**Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the prophet Isaiah.  
The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light.  
The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;  
Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone.  
You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing,  
As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils.  
For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests.  
They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace.  
His dominion is vast and forever peaceful,  
From David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains  
By judgment and justice, both now and forever.**

A minister who is a priest or deacon says the prayer of blessing with hands outstretched; a lay minister says the prayer with hands joined.

**Lord God,  
your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior,  
who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin.  
Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this wreath;  
may their light reflect the splendor of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.**

All respond. **Amen.**

Or:

**Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:  
he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,  
he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation.  
Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath.  
May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.  
May he come quickly and not delay.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord.**

All respond. **Amen.**

The home ceremony for use of the Advent wreath is simple. It consists of Collects, hymns and prayers proper to the Advent season. There are many to choose from online. The prayer I included below can serve as an framework for you and your family. Feel free to add Scripture passages from the readings used during Holy Mass heard during the Advent season.

During the first week one candle is left burning during the evening meal, at prayers or at bedtime. Two candles are lighted on the second Sunday and allowed to burn as before. The prayer for the week is:

**Parent: Let us pray. O Lord, stir up our hearts that we may prepare for Thy only begotten Son, that through His coming we may be made worthy to serve Thee with pure souls. Through the same Christ our Lord.**

**All: Amen.**

Three candles, including the rose candle, are lighted on Gaudete, the third Sunday, and during that week. The following prayer is said:

**Parent: Let us pray. We humbly beg Thee, O Lord, to listen to our prayers; and by the grace of Thy coming bring light into our darkened minds. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.**

**All: Amen.**

All four candles are lighted on the fourth Sunday and allowed to burn as before. The prayer said the fourth week is:

**Parent: Let us pray. Stir up Thy might, we pray Thee, O Lord, and come; rescue us through Thy great strength so that salvation, which has been hindered by our sins, may be hastened by the grace of Thy gentle mercy. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.**

**All: Amen.**

At the end of Advent, candles and ribbons are changed to white, evergreens renewed if necessary, and tiny Christmas balls added to decorate the wreath. Perhaps you could place the wreath near the front door where it adds a festive note to the house and gives you a chance to explain the wreath to neighbors and friends who have not seen it previously. The wreath, unless it sheds, is kept until Epiphany.

How good are you at reading signs, especially signs which God sends our way? The people of Jesus' time expected that the coming of the Messiah would be accompanied by extraordinary signs and wonders. Jesus' first coming was clouded in mystery and surprising wonderment: Even though he was the rightful heir to the throne of King David, he was born in obscurity in a cave at Bethlehem, near the place where David had watched over his father's sheep some 1000 years before. A choir of mighty angels chose to announce the good news to a small band of lowly shepherds keeping their night watch nearby. Learned magi from the East, who recognized a great omen in the heavenly sky, followed the star until it led them to Bethlehem. They alone found the child with his mother and paid him homage as the newborn king of Israel. When Jesus humbly submitted to baptism at the River Jordan, the heavenly Father spoke audibly for those nearby who were willing to listen, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased."



#### ***Signs which point to the Lord's coming to reign with power and great glory***

Jesus, during his public ministry performed numerous signs: turning water into wine, calming the storm at sea and walking on water, multiplying seven loaves of bread in the wilderness to feed 5000 people, healing the blind and the lame, expelling demons, and raising the dead. While many believed in Jesus, many also questioned his signs and refused to believe his claim to be the Messiah sent by the heavenly Father to suffer and die for our sake and for our salvation on the cross of Calvary. Jesus' last and greatest sign during his earthly ministry was his rising from the tomb on the third day after his crucifixion. This sign demonstrated his power to defeat death itself and to give abundant everlasting life to all who believed in him.


#### ***Indifference and rejection of the Gospel lead to destruction***

What can keep us from recognizing the signs of the Lord's presence and his action today? Indifference and the temptation to slacken off - to become passive and lethargic or to fall asleep spiritually. It is very easy to get caught up in the things of the present moment or to be weighed down with troubles. The Lord knows our shortcomings and struggles and he gives us the strength to bear our burdens and to walk in his way of holiness. But there is one thing he doesn't tolerate: an attitude of indifference, being passive, not caring, and doing nothing when we could be actively seeking God and his kingdom! God is ready to give us fresh vision, hope, and grace to walk in his ways. He wants to work in and through us for his glory. That is why he expects more of us than we can do by ourselves. His grace enables us to actively watch for his action in our lives, and to actively pray for perseverance and endurance when we face trials and difficulties. The Lord gives us his strength to overcome temptation, especially from apostasy - the denial of the Lord Jesus out of fear or pride. God is ever ready to fill us with his strength and divine power. Is your heart hungry for God or is it weighed down by other things?

#### ***Advent season reminds us that we are pilgrims and exiles longing for our home with God***

Many churches in the East and West, since the early first centuries of the Christian era, have marked special seasons to celebrate the central truths of the Christian faith. The Advent season which precedes Christmas and Epiphany reminds us that we are a pilgrim people, aliens and exiles in this age who long for our true home with God in his heavenly kingdom, and who await with joyful hope the return of the Lord Jesus at the end of the age. When will the Lord Jesus come again? No one but the Father in heaven knows the day. But it is a certain fact that we are living in the end times, the close of this present age! The end times begin with the first coming of Jesus Christ (his Incarnation which we celebrate at Christmas and Epiphany) and culminates in his final return on the Day of Judgment.

*Lord Jesus, may I never lose sight of the signs of your presence in my life and the signs of your action in the world today. Free me from spiritual dullness, indifference, and every distraction that would keep me from you.* [dailyscripture.com](http://dailyscripture.com)



## The U.S. Supreme Court and the Future of Abortion in America (An evening with prolife attorney Nikolus Nikas)


**Please join us on Wednesday, December 1st, 7 PM in the Gym**

On December 1st, the United States Supreme Court will hear arguments in the most important abortion case in the last 30 years: *Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization*. This case arises out of a challenge to a Mississippi law that bans most abortions after the 15th week of pregnancy. The *Dobbs* case has the real potential to reverse *Roe v. Wade*, the infamous decision legalizing abortion and leading to over 60 million abortions since 1973.

In a dynamic, informative and passionate one-hour presentation, longtime parishioner and prolife lawyer, Nikolus Nikas, will present the history of abortion jurisprudence in the U.S. and what it would mean, and would not mean, if *Roe v. Wade* is overturned. Nikas will have just listened to the oral arguments in the Supreme Court (online) that morning and will offer his insight into the Justices' questions and what it might mean for the future.

Nikas is co-founder and general counsel of the Bioethics Defense Fund, a public-interest legal and educational organization that creates winning arguments for life to benefit lawmakers, courts, students and citizens across the United States and abroad. Nikas addresses bioethics issues including abortion, healthcare rights of conscience, human cloning/embryonic stem cell research, eugenics, physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia.

Nikas has spoken hundreds of times to law students at such universities as Harvard, Yale, Columbia, Cornell, Stanford, Notre Dame, Arizona State, Northwestern, University of Chicago, Catholic U. and many others. He has spoken at medical schools such as Vanderbilt, University of Chicago, University of Southern California, University of Arizona in Phoenix, Louisiana State University and Creighton University. He has spoken in Italy, France, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Poland, the Republic of Georgia, South Korea, Australia, New Zealand, Mexico, Costa Rica and Trinidad and Tobago.
