

Easter and God's Mercy

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Easter to all of you and a special welcome to all of our visitors! I pray as you celebrate Easter Mass with us, you may come to know the peace of God in your hearts now and always. You are always welcome to come and to thank God for His many blessings most especially His Son who has risen from the dead and offers forgiveness from our sins! I find that people who

are struggling with anxiety, depression, and loneliness is often related to a broken relationship with God. That relationship can be healed and restored with God's mercy.

If you find yourself living with a mortal (deadly) sin, come an experience the freedom and healing that can only be found in Our Lord and experience His mercy in the Sacrament of Confession. His mercy endures forever. Now we have begun the season of Easter! Last evening, at the Easter Vigil, we welcomed our newest Catholics. The Elect stepped forward to be received into full communion in the Catholic Church. They received the Sacrament of Baptism to wash away the stain of original sin. They were Confirmation and received the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They received the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ for the first time in Holy Communion! They formalized their commitment to Our Lord by "turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel" for the rest of their lives and hopefully for all eternity. We give thanks to God for these amazing men and women who heard God calling them into the Church.

In the next few weeks, we will be baptizing more babies as well as preparing for our young people to receive their sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation on May 18th with the Most Reverend Eduardo Nevares, Auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Phoenix.

Everything we experience as Catholics at Easter proclaims to us the joy of our faith in the Risen Lord! Christ has conquered death on the cross by rising from the dead on this glorious day! Our personal deaths and those of our loved ones have been conquered, too, through our Baptismal commitment to Jesus.

May God's blessings overflow in your life this Easter! May your heart be filled with all the joys of the Risen Christ in our midst! May the fifty-day celebration of Easter deepen your relationship with Our Risen Lord!



Not Just a Day, Easter is a Season!

Eastertide is the oldest season of the liturgical year. It was celebrated as one comprehensive feast of the paschal victory of the Lord Jesus Christ: His resurrection, ascension, gift of the Spirit and the birth of the Church, all understood together as different aspects of the same mystery. Tertullian referred to the Fifty Days as a whole as "the Pentecost," describing this span of

time as a "space" in which one can experience the expansiveness, freedom, and boundlessness of resurrected life.

Easter is a foretaste of heaven, an anticipation of the Kingdom, a time of joy—an Alleluia time. St. Augustine called Christians an Easter people. He said, "We are an Alleluia people and Alleluia is our song." He saw the 50 days as "joyful days that point to a future life when we are destined to reign with the Lord." It is a time for feasting, especially on the Eucharist.

The 50 days of Easter are a "space" filled with the presence of the risen Christ, who shows himself over and over to us, his Church, as he manifested himself to the apostles. It is important for us to see the Easter event not only as something that happened long ago but also as an ongoing reality that is very present NOW in our own lives as Christians. Just as it was with the apostles, everywhere we turn, there is his Spirit outpoured, shaping the new creation. We know from the Scriptures that his disciples did not always recognize him. The challenge for us is to recognize the Spirit in our daily lives.

Ascension is not a departure, but rather a promise that the Lord will return. He goes to prepare a place for us. It is therefore a feast of great joy and an integral part of the Easter event.



Divine Mercy Sunday & the Divine Mercy Novena

The Feast of Divine Mercy, celebrated on the Octave of Easter (*the Sunday* <u>after Easter Sunday</u>), is a relatively new addition to the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar.

Celebrating the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ, as revealed by Christ Himself to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, this feast was extended to the entire Catholic Church by Pope John

Paul II on April 30, 2000, the day that he canonized Saint Faustina.

Jesus asked that the *Feast of the Divine Mercy* be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, *the lukewarm and indifferent*.



Please Welcome our Newly Initiated Neophytes who were received into the Church at the Easter Vigil





As parishioners, we are called to support our neophytes by welcoming them, praying for them, and inviting them to participate in the various groups and activities of our community. We have the same baptismal call to welcome all new members. As we enter into the Easter Season, ask yourself how you and your family can more fully support our adult initiation program.

The Rite or Order of Initiation for Adults (OCIA/RCIA) is a process that includes a series of interviews, rites, formation and commitment. It is a journey and, for the unbaptized adult, the process generally takes a year or more and for those baptized in other Christian faith traditions it takes several months.

Our current OCIA team consists of eight adult catechists and one deacon. Over the summer months, we meet twice a month for 90 minute inquiry sessions and, during the school year, we meet every Monday for two hours for catechetical formation. We often have catechumens and/or candidates that are in need of godparents or sponsors. Some have out of town godparents or sponsors and are in need of parishioners to serve as mentors.

If you or someone you know would like to help with or participate as a catechumen or candidate in the adult initiation process, please contact the parish office. Join our team in praying for and welcoming our newly initiated Catholics.





If you are an adult in need of Confirmation only, preparation classes are now open. You start the program through an in-person interview. All interviews must take place prior to the first preparation session. See the details below:


