Church and State (Part VI of VI)



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Catholic Church is subject to an increasing hostility and discrimination that has never been seen in our lifetime. Attacks against Christian institutions and the maligning of Christian beliefs by the government, the courts, the media, and popular culture are reaching unprecedented and unacceptable levels. People who wish to practice their faith are being told by the elites that our faith is only to be seen as “personal” and “private” if it is to be seen at all.

We have all witnessed how Catholics and other believers are being told to keep their faith to themselves. That oppressive bullying is wrong and cannot be tolerated by anyone, anywhere, in any age. Our faith in God and what we believe as Catholics does influence how we live now and for eternity. Our faith impacts every aspect of our lives including how we carry out our duties as citizens and how we vote in our elections.

God’s beautiful plan of love for creation and for every human life will not tolerate any sort of anti-Christian bigotry. We are called to proclaim the Kingdom of God with love. God’s Kingdom is *“a city of love and truth where every life is welcomed, cherished, and defended, especially those lives that need more care and attention, those lives that can be a burden to others. Our new evangelization must seek a society worthy of the sanctity and dignity of the human person, where no one is a stranger, and no one is left behind or thrown away.”* (Catholics in the Public Square, Forward, Archbishop Gomez)

Our faith in the One True God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit is meant to be expressed in public ways and in the public square in works of mercy by word and example. *“Wherever dignity is denied and wherever there is injustice, we are called to defend life. Our society must know that, as long as there are Christians, there should never be a reason for anyone to suffer without hope and help.”* (Catholics in the Public Square, Forward, Archbishop Gomez)

Bishop Olmsted wrote in **Catholics in the Public Square Revised 4th Edition** (which I highly recommend and can be found online): *“It is our duty to engage the culture, not run from it. We must place our trust in the Lord and know that by doing His will and speaking the truth in love, God will make all things work for the good. It is also the duty of the Catholic faithful to support courageous people who do this through both our actions and prayers.”*

Let us pray that God will continue to raise up faithful Catholics who will be responsible citizens in our country. May we all have the courage to vote to defend life and to preserve the good work Our Lord has begun in us. Let us pray that Our Lord will grant us a generous portion of prudence, honesty, integrity, and lasting peace for His glory and the salvation of our nation.

Who is the Greatest in God's Kingdom?

Whose glory do you seek? There can be no share in God's glory without the cross. When Jesus prophesied his own betrayal and crucifixion, it did not make any sense to his disciples because it did not fit their understanding of what the Messiah came to do. And they were afraid to ask further questions! Like a person who might receive a bad verdict from the doctor and then refuse to ask further questions, they, too, didn't want to know any more. How often do we reject what we do not wish to see? We have heard the good news of God's

word and we know the consequences of accepting it or rejecting it. But do we give it our full allegiance and mold our lives according to it? Ask the Lord to fill you with his Holy Spirit and to inspire within you a reverence for his word and a readiness to obey it.

Do you compare yourself with others?

How ashamed the disciples must have been when Jesus overheard them arguing about who among them was the greatest! But aren't we like the disciples? We compare ourselves with others and desire their praise. The appetite for glory and greatness seems to be inbred in us. Who doesn't cherish the ambition to be "somebody" whom others admire rather than a "nobody"? Even the psalms speak about the glory God has destined for us. You have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor (Psalm 8:5).

Jesus made a dramatic gesture by embracing a child to show his disciples who really is the greatest in the kingdom of God. What can a little child possibly teach us about greatness? Children in the ancient world had no rights, position, or privileges of their own. They were socially at the "bottom of the rung" and at the service of their parents, much like the household staff and domestic servants.

Who is the greatest in God's kingdom?

What is the significance of Jesus' gesture? Jesus elevated a little child in the presence of his disciples by placing the child in a privileged position of honor. It is customary, even today, to seat the guest of honor at the right side of the host. Who is the greatest in God's kingdom? The one who is humble and lowly of heart - who instead of asserting their rights willingly empty themselves of pride and self-seeking glory by taking the lowly position of a servant or child.

Jesus, himself, is our model. He came not to be served, but to serve (Matthew 20:28). Paul the Apostle states that Jesus emptied himself and took the form of a servant (Philippians 2:7). Jesus lowered himself (he whose place is at the right hand of God the Father) and took on our lowly nature that he might raise us up and clothe us in his divine nature.

God wants to fill us with his own glory

God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble (James 4:6). If we want to be filled with God's life and power, then we need to empty ourselves of everything which stands in the way - pride, self-seeking glory, vanity, etc. God wants empty vessels so he can fill them with his own glory, power, and love (2 Corinthians 4:7). Are you ready to humble yourself and to serve as Jesus did?

Lord Jesus, by your cross you have redeemed the world and revealed your glory and triumph over sin and death. May I never fail to see your glory and victory in the cross. Help me to conform my life to your will and to follow in your way of holiness. dailyscripture.net

St. Bernadette SVdP Conference Fifth Sunday Next Weekend September 28th & 29th

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded in 1833 by a small group of college students who were challenged in a debate by someone who did not believe in God to explain what they were personally doing to help others as a result of their faith. They responded by creating the first Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

The same question resonates throughout the world today as we are constantly being asked, *What difference is your faith making?* The answer is simple. Catholics throughout the world donate and serve on a regular basis to help alleviate suffering and poverty and that is certainly true of the parishioners here at St. Bernadette Parish.

Since our last Fifth Sunday collection, your donations have enabled us to distribute \$18,969 to landlords to help pay rents and nearly \$2,000 to help pay utility bills. Your generosity has helped us to keep the lights on, a safe place to live, and food on the table for 50 of our brothers and sisters who were in need and who live within our parish boundaries.

When we receive a call for assistance, two Vincentians go to the home and visit with the family. We listen to their story, look at their bills, and prayerfully discern how we can partner with them to assist them with their greatest needs. We pray with them and sit and listen to them with compassion and mercy. Often times, they tell us that no other agency even answered their call but that it means so much that we not only called them but we took the time to listen to their story and we made the effort to come to them.

On your behalf and in the name of the Lord, we go to answer the cries of the poor. Thank you for helping us help others by your donations and your ongoing support. Our faith does make a difference in the lives of others

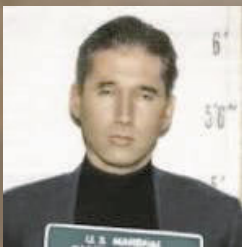


