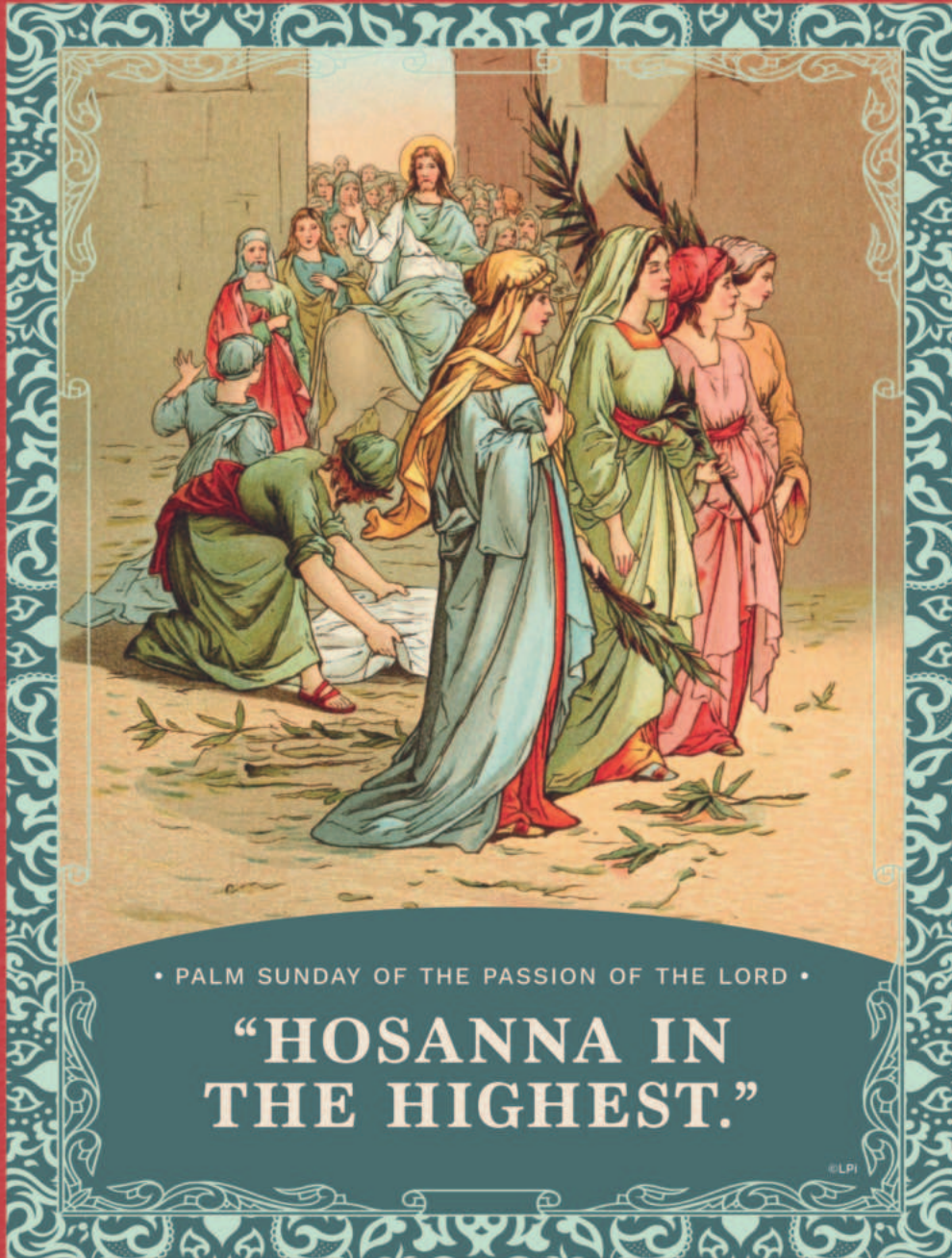

Pastor's Notes

Palm Sunday



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we begin the holiest week of the Church calendar. On Palm Sunday, the Sacred Scriptures invite us into Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Today we hear shouts of "Hosanna" as the people joyfully greet Our Lord, cheering and welcoming Him with palm branches. What an interesting way of honoring the Messiah. Notice how the King of Kings enters riding a colt. This is not because they couldn't find a fitting white stallion. Jesus intentionally offers Himself in humility to show that His kingdom is not of this world. It is the procession of a king, the King of the Universe, but there are no trumpets, elegant garments, or signs of wealth. They cried out: "Hosanna! Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" This is no ordinary entry: this is the most extraordinary King. The King's "red carpet" was made of capes and palm branches. The "soldiers" were His disciples, who would soon desert Him in His hour of greatest need.

As we walk with Jesus all the way to Calvary, Our Lord invites each of us to enter this Holy Week with humility. Your willingness to follow Our Lord this week can lead you to surrender in obedience to God, which in turn, can lead to conversion and contrition for sins. The palm branches we carry today are meant to be a sign of peace and hope. The branches are also a sign that you have chosen to follow Jesus on the way. I encourage you to take your blessed palm branches home and place them behind your crucifix as a reminder that you have cheered and welcomed Jesus, our King, and followed Him to the cross.

Please pray for all the priests of our diocese on Holy Monday. On that day, we will renew our priestly vows together with our bishop in the cathedral. Also, during this Eucharist, the bishop will consecrate the oils used to anoint God's people: the oil of the sick, which brings healing and comfort to the ill; the oil of catechumens, which strengthens those preparing for baptism; and the Holy Chrism, which is used in the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and ordination. For those who wish to participate, the Mass will be held at Ss. Simon and Jude at 4:00pm.

On Holy Thursday, we commemorate the Institution of the Eucharist and the Ministerial Priesthood. The opportunity to go to confession will begin at 7:30 a.m. in the church until we finish. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be at 7:00 p.m. Afterward, we will process the Blessed Sacrament to the Ramada, where we will set up an altar and remain there in adoration of Our Eucharistic King until midnight. On Good Friday, a day of penance, fasting, and reflection, we will have confessions immediately following the Lord's Passion which begins at 3:00 p.m. The collection on Good Friday supports the work of the Franciscans in the Holy Land who care for the sacred shrines, minister to parishes, provide formation and education in communities and schools, and care for the basic needs of the people in the Holy Land. Lastly, the Stations of the Cross begin at 7:00 p.m. that evening.

Holy Saturday is a day of silence and meditation as we reflect on the passion and death of Our Savior. It is also good to recall the Virgin Mary's broken heart at the loss of her Son. In the evening, we will celebrate the Easter Vigil beginning outside at 8:00 p.m. The Easter Vigil is the most important celebration of the liturgical year. It is the heart of the Church's life. I invite you to celebrate this Holy Night of the Resurrection as we welcome the newest members of our faith into the Catholic Church.

The Easter Triduum, which begins on Holy Thursday and ends on Easter Sunday, is the most solemn and important time of the liturgical year. It celebrates the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ - His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Let us keep each other in prayer as we live this Holy Week with grateful hearts for all Our Lord has done, is doing, and will do for us. May you celebrate the Easter Triduum in grace, understanding the love God has for us through His Son, Our Savior and the gift of the Holy Spirit always leading us to the fullness of life and love.

THE HUMANITY OF HOLY WEEK



We have all sold Jesus out, at one point or another. Some of us have done it more than once, and we've done it for a lot less than 30 pieces of silver.

We have all denied Christ, and we have done it more than three times and under much less pressure than Peter, who feared for his life when he shouted,
"I do not know the man!"

We have all struck the face of God — out of anger? Fear? Confusion? All of the above? — screaming, in agony, "Prophecy for me!"

At one point or another, we have all looked at our Lord beaten and betrayed, and we have all said, as Pilate did: "What shall I do with Jesus called Christ?"

And we have all hung on the cross chosen for us, crying out in bewilderment:
"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Holy Week is a week where we see humanity, in all its vulnerability and ignorance. We see it in the "villains" of the piece, like Judas, and in the morally neutral characters like Pilate and the Jews who have been misled about Jesus. We even see it in the "good guys" like Peter.

In this, the holiest week of the year, we see ourselves at our very worst. The chasm between man and his Creator is an ancient one, and it is driven deep and wide — by the pridefulness of Adam and Eve, yes, but also by every poor choice you and I have ever made.



Every "I don't know the man!"

The **Enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus** is a beautiful and profound traditional Catholic devotion designed for the family. It involves inviting Jesus into your hearts and homes, recognizing His reign of love and mercy over your lives and families.

WHY: The **request is directly from Jesus** Himself! He told St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, "I will bless the homes in which an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored."

An image of the Sacred Heart is more than just a picture. It is meant to be a source of daily devotion and grace to draw us toward God and enlighten our souls with Divine Truths. It is a commitment to live in accordance with His teachings, to foster a loving and faithful family environment, and to spread His love to others. By enthroning the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we acknowledge Him as the King of our hearts and homes, seeking His divine guidance and protection. Pope Pius XI, in his encyclical "Miserentissimus Redemptor," highlighted that the devotion to the Most Sacred Heart is the extraordinary remedy for the extraordinary needs of our time.

HOW: To schedule the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart, **contact Catherine Smith, President of the Legion of Mary - Our Lady of Lourdes Praesidium at (403) 580-9605**, and a prayer ceremony will take place in your home with a priest and members of the Legion of Mary, as an act of homage offered to Jesus Christ, King of Kings.

WHO: **Parishioners** of St. Bernadette Catholic Church are welcome to participate in the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart; a devotion designed for the **family**.

WHAT must I do:

1. Set a date with the Legion of Mary.
2. Have a Sacred Heart of Jesus image (photo or statue).
3. Select a place of honor reserved for the image, prepare a "throne" or "altar."
4. Invite relatives and friends to be present.
5. There are various ways to **prepare your heart...**
 - Your entire family should try to receive Communion at Mass before the Enthronement.
 - Your family may start a Sacred Heart Novena 9 days prior.
 - You may also commit to a 33-day Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

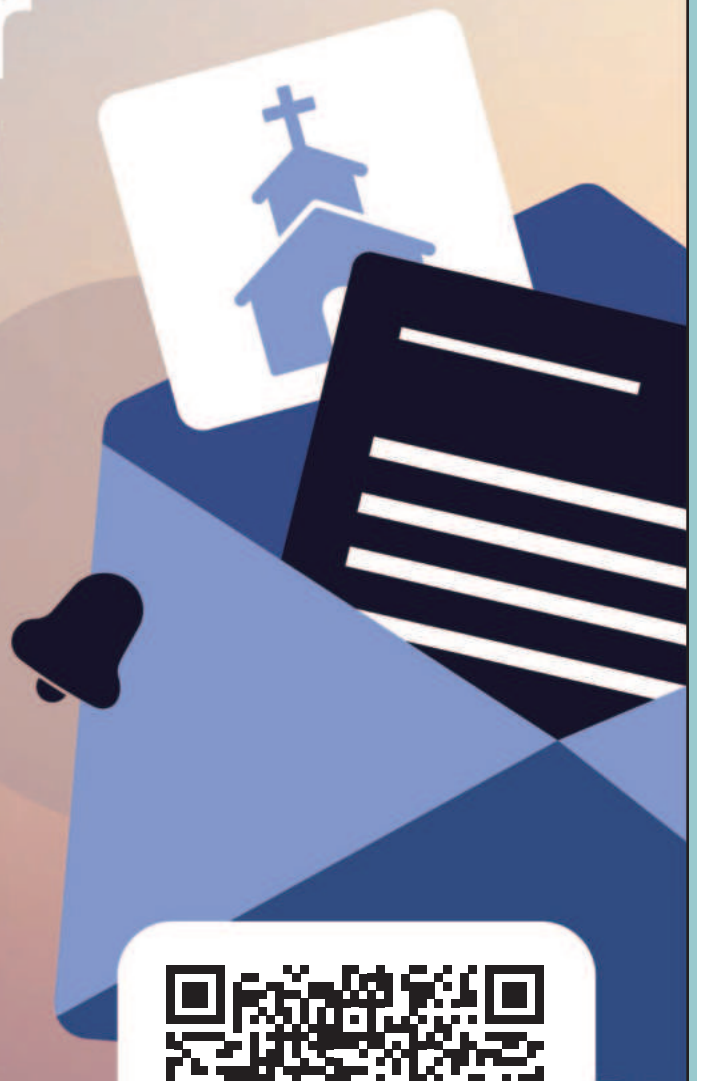
